



Editorial

Reading the Sunday newxpaper has become rather a national past time and most of us like to stretch out on a Sunday afternoon and pass a relaxing few hours after the Sunday dinner. The come in all shapes and sizes (sizes anyway) and the reading they provide runs from educational to just plain muck. We are, however, inclined to accept whatever story is dished up as being factual and not as often occurs fanciful.

It was therefore rather disconcerting to read in a recent Sunday paper how the 'Great Powers' view our neutrality and how our friends and neighbours have made arrangements to drop a few atomic bombs on just a few areas of the Country in the event of a serious war. It is nice to know that ones friends are always thinking of one, and how they would be 'pleased' to wipe out the city of Dublin, Bantry Oil stores, and just a few other little portions of the Country. 'With friends like that who needs enemies?' We are not referring just to England but apparently America and the Adefender of small nations' Russia all seem to have the same sweet thoughts.

Factual or fanciful we have, however, to seriously consider our situation either as neutrals or beligerents and see what we can do about our situation. An atomic bomb dropped on Dublin would seriously effect us. Even at this distance from the city we would be in the area of, at least, light damage to property and, of course, we would be at serious risk from fallout. With all the current unrest in the world and talk of 'when the next war commences' it would be stupid of us not to consider what we can do to protect ourselves should the worst come to the worst.

There are those who take the gloomiest view and say that there is nothing we can do but wait to be eliminated and this is just a fallacy. Yes, if a bomb drops close to you, there is no need to worry (except perhaps for your immortal soul and that is in your own hands). In fringe areas such as Maynooth, we have to consider how we will be placed after the bomb has gone off and how to protect ourselves from fallout. By following the routine laid down it is quite possible to survive and live a long life afterwards but one must consider the situation now and have ones plans made. How better to instruct yourself on these matters than by joining the Civil Defence services now and being ready if and when the time comes. The Chief Civil Defence Officer, St. Mary's Naas or any other Civil Defence personnel can tell you what to do.

Consider the matter well - one day your life might depend on it. A few hours training might make a difference in the long run.

I.C.A. NOTES

The Winter Council Meeting in Dundalk gave us some food for discussion.

The report was given by Nora McDermott as it was her 1st time to attend Council. She impressed and gave us some figures e.g. There are 956 Guilds with 25,985 members which pleased Mrs Camilla Hannon, National President, who said recently that there was an upwards turn in numbers, reversing the trend of the past few years.

The Inter-federation competition for Spring/Summer is "Design a Flag for the I.C.A." We had a lively discussion on some aspects of our constitution and their relevance to 1981.

Our talk was on First Aid and was given by Marie Kelly, Civil Defence, Her main theme was on ways of preventing deterioration of the Casualty by Checking - (a) Breathing . (b)
Bleeding - (c) trying to relieve pain.
These points are followed by - Controlling traffic at the scene . if relevent.
Removing the fire hazard - removing debris - covering face with damp cloth if gas is the cause. Next came transport and Doctor and the fact that it is essential that you check that the person who was to send for both these i.e. Doctor & Ambulance, have actually done this.

All these points and other details of various types of first aid were made east to understand in this very necessary art by Mrs. Kelly. The one fact that stood out was that people are inclined to leave the person who is in shock until all others have been seen to and quite often a person can actually die from shock, so they should never be ignored 'till last.

On Tuesday 24th March we are host to the rest of Kildare Federation at the Spring Meeting being held here in our Parish Hall. All our members will bake for this event, we will have over 200 fellow I.C.A. members coming. Each guild only has to host this Meeting once every 3 years., so we are quite looking forward to it. A note of thanks was proposed by Nora McDermott and seconded by Lise O'Farrell. Next was a report by Imelda Desmond on her week in An Grianan. She did 'Decorative Panels and was very impressed with her teacher Mrs. Smith. She had lots of ideas for doing 'Art Awards' and Bronnrai e.g. Local History, Acting, Flowers etc. As we intend to start our own Library in the Guild we were really grateful to Mrs. Fegan

for her lovely gift of 2 books to start this - Creative Needlecraft & Good Housekeeping Needlecraft.

CIIr. BERNARD DURKAN NOTES

The Eastern Health Board replying to a question by Cllr. Durkan on the number of Children in Kildare awaiting ORTHODONTIC treatment (i.e. for dental defects) was informed that there are 1,290 children await - ing assessment. Due however to a shortage of trained personal etc. it was not possible to deal rapidly with all cases but additional personal is being trained and it is hoped to speed up the process.

In reply to a further question by ClIr.
Durkan on the number of children
requiring 'Speech Therapy', the
number of sessions each child can
expect, and if the situation was satisfactory?

The Board stated that there are 291 children awaiting assessment (being seen at the rate of 5 per week) and 225 assessed children in need of regular therapy also seen at the rate of 5 per week.

(Note . It would take 58 weeks to see each child and 45 weeks to treat each child .N ot at all satisfactory).

Further replies from the Co. Council on Clir. Durkan's enquiries. :-

- 1) The Council has agreed to provide ramps at a Number of kerbs to fac ilitat Wheel Chairs etc.
- 2) The Council intend to convert 'The Pound' at Mill Street into a small Park. Levelling work has been carried out.

3) (Re allocation of private building sites at Maynooth & Celbridge). It was hoped to allocate available sites this month but the provision of additional sites would depend on Capital allocation and the priority adopted by the Councillors.

PRESS RELEASE !

Clir. Bernard Durkan, speaking to Branch Members in 'Leixlip' called for the re-opening of the Railway Stations in Leixlip, Maynooth, Kilcock & Enfield, in order to facilitate Commuters. He said that it was ridiculous to have these Stations closed and the Western line underutilised , when the Main Road from Kilcock to Dublin was suffering from severe traffic congestion. He said that the same case could be made, for the re-opening to Commuter traffic of the Stations in many of the major Towns in Co. Kildare, and that if elected in the forthcoming general election, he would strive to achieve that objective.

He also stated that as a first step in this direction, a 'skeleton' commuter service could be provided i.e. one Train at peak hours, morning and evening could stop at each of the stations, even on a temporary basis in order to evaluate the need.

Clir. Durkan said that the number of working hours saved by the public if the service is provided must surely benefit our economy.

- (4) When the new Reservoir at Ballygoran is constructed the Council will have a safeguard against future loss of water pressure in the Maynooth area.
- (5) Request for Junior Warden Service for Dunboyne Road Maynooth (Primary School) has been referred to Road Safety Officer.
- (6) Having regard to the financial situation the area engineer can only carry out strengthening to the sides of the Maynooth Celbridge Road•
- (7) The Department of P & T are to contact Mr. Brady following his representations to them re phone services for Cluain Aoibhinn Carton Court Maynooth Park.

Letter re Carton Avenue.

I am directed by the County Manager to refer to the matter of Carton Ave., Maynooth, which was raised recently at the Clane Area Sites Committee Meeting, and the position in regard to this property is as follows:-

- 1) The Kildare County Council, on ascertaining that Carton Avenue was available for purchase, obtained a valuation therefor and entered into negotiations with Carton Properties Ltd. for the purchase of the Avenue 11 acres approx. for the sum of £10,000.
- 2) Carton Properties Ltd. agreed to sell the Avenue to the Council for this sum so that it could be developed as an amenity area subject to right of access through the town gate to the existing gate lodge.



- 4) On the basis of this information, The Council proceeded to secure the boundary along both sides of the Avenue, inclusing the closing off of at least three field gates which appeared to open on to the Avenue.
- 5) Subsequen to this action, correspondence was received from Messrs. John J O'Hare & Co. Solicitors, on behalf of Messrs. J. P. & M. Doyle Ltd., claiming that their company had an agree ment with Carton Properties Ltd which gave them certain rights across the Avenue, linking land on both sides, and copy of the appropriate section of the agreement, which appeared to in dicate that J.P. & M. Doyle Ltd. had a right of way at three points across the Avenue, was submitted. On the basis of the extract from the Deed of Conveyance, the Council's sol icitors advised that J.P. & M. Doyle Ltd., as the owners of the land on either side of the Avenue, had a right to cross the Avenue for all purposes on foot and with or without horses, cattle, other farm stock, farm implements and machinery, over three defined passageways 15 ft. wide.

J. P. & M. Doyle Ltd. also had per mission to lay a 12" pipe across the Avenue.

These rights are subject to J. P. & M. Doyle Ltd. keeping the gateways at the opening secure so as to prevent stock straying from their lands on to the Avenue. They are also required to keep the crossing points in clean condition and in repair, and they are further obliged to maintain the boundary fences on each side of the Avenue in good repair and condition so as prevent stock trepassing on the Avenue.

While the crossing points are somewhat of an inconvenience, the obligations placed on Messrs. J. P. & M. Doyle Ltd in relation to these rights, and the responsibility which they have for the maintenance of fencing, minimeses the inconvenience to a very great extent. It is considered that the rights of way referred to will not create any problem and that the development of Carton Avenue will provide a much needed amenity in Maynooth and will ensure the preservation of the Avenue. The entrance to the Avenue from the rear has been fenced off so as to prevent trepass on the Avenue from that area. The provision of a gate at this end of the Avenue will be considered when the scheme for its develop ment is being prepared.

I hope the above clarifies the position for you and if there is any further information you require, please let me know.






