## GREENFIELD ESTATE RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION

You will be pleased to know that the fund-raising part of our present ground-rent campaign is going well and that we have reached the hitherto elusive target-figure of £20,000. We are now nearing the end of our door-to-door canvassing and will soon close the money-raising part of things so as to get down to real business. Every resident is being given the opportunity of saying a free yes or no to the present offer - or of giving a commitment to pay in the near future. After that, it will be a matter between the individual resident and the ground landlord, and the tacit solidarity among residents of the estate over withholding payment of ground-rent will no longer obtain.

The plan of campaign from now on is being carefully considered. We are in the process of getting a number of quotations for the road resurfacing work which, of course, the fund money will help finance. The Council are being kept informed of all proceedings. We have been keeping you also up to date by means of circular letters of all new developments and will continue to do so.

The completion of the estate is naturally engrossing our attention and other matters are inclined to be given second place. Mr. O'Brien of Maynooth Park did a great job with the first cutting of the Greens in Straffan Way and Maynooth Park. The sit-on mower that he was using would cost in the region of £1000 to buy for ourselves. When cutting the Greens for the second time, the handful of volunteer residents, doing so have had to be satisfied with two or three small motor mowers, and this involves a lot of work. (By the way, if you happen to see residents cutting or raking grass, please don't think that that is their business; all hands are very welcome. We know we did not notify you of the first cutting: we will try to do so in future, so that the Committee can rely on volunteers to at least help with the patch in front of their houses.)

Grass-cutting is annoying but we will have to try and organize some way of tackling it on a year-to-year basis.

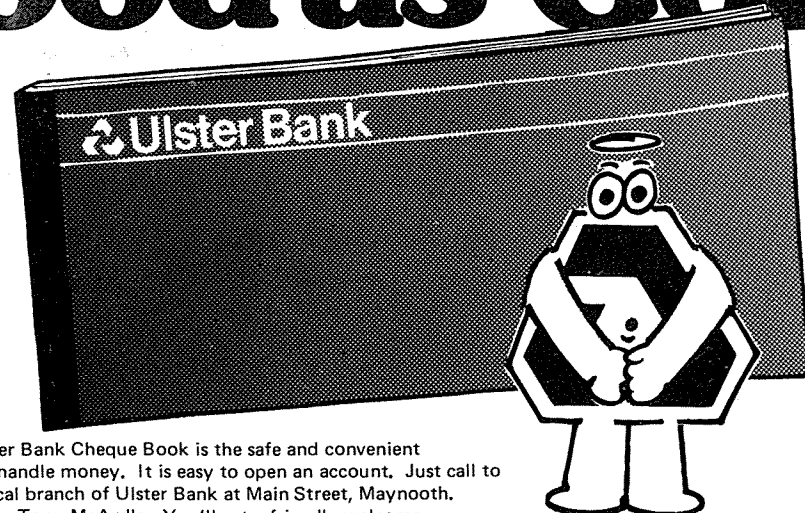

We all know, of course that we constitute only a minor part of the Constituency as a whole but we cannot help but feel a bit possessive.

While congratulating our local T.D. we are not overlooking our other four Representatives in the County M/s. Power - McCreavy - Bermingham and Dukes to whom we also extend our congratulations. Nor do we overlook our second local candidate Gerry Brady who was so narrowly beaten by Alen Dukes. What a celebration we would have had if we had two local T.D.s and perhaps next time it will be a double celebration.

The Elections were not all joy for everybody and many prospective voters were very disappointed on arrival at the Polling Station to find that their names were omitted from the Register of Electors, and were therefore unable to vote. Disappointing in particular to those who had been on the local Registrar for years and whose names were mysteriously omitted. From inquiries we are lead to believe that as many as fifty names were missing and perhaps more. Nor was Maynooth unique in this as we understand that there were omissions in many other Polling Stations around the County. We feel that perhaps this could be a matter of investigation by our County Representatives least it should happen again. Judging also by press reports Kildare was not the only County with problems in this and other matters and it looks as if the whole electoral system requires investigation.

Again we offer our heartiest congratulations to our elected Representatives and to our townsman, Bernard Durkan, in particular. To Gerry Brady we say "next time we need you too"

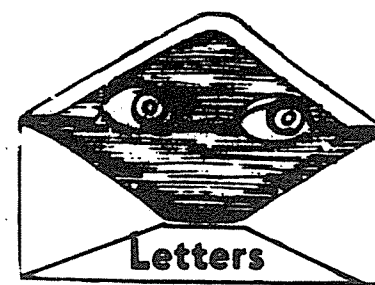

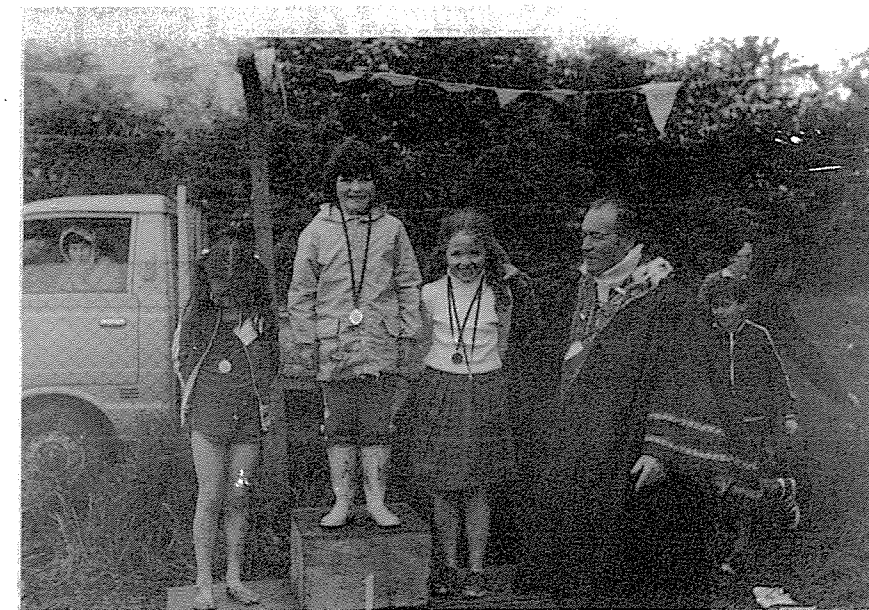

## MAYNOOTH TOWN A.F.C. NOTES

Well another Season has drawn to a close and with it the usual review of the past Season.

The Club won its first League thanks to the efforts of the THIRD Team - no doubt the highlight of the Season. After a set back in the first match in Division 3c. Gerry McTernan's men soon established a firm grip on the Division and went on to win it comfortably, maintaining a proud unbeaten home record for the second Season running (Jimmy Magee take note), in the process. In fact, so well did "Macker" assess the dangers in the Division that he was able to make the first three in the table as early as October. Congratulations to all concerned, namely - J. Graham - R. McTernan - J. Geoghegan - D. Foy - M. Murtagh - T. Nelson - G. Tracey - K. Walshe - K. Kilduff - T. Harte - W. Saults - N. Farrell P. Mahon - J. Saults - T. McTernan - G. McTernan Player/Manager and last, but not least Simon Mokoena all the way from South Africa - the first African player to play for the Club. Simon was recently gone home and, no doubt, is spreading the gospel of Maynooth Town some 4000 miles away.

In the Leinster Junior Shield they were knocked out by Step-a-side Utd. (recent winners of the A.U.L. Subsidiary Cup).

After beating lazier while in the Conway Cup, they were most unlucky to suffer a number of setbacks (bad weather, post-ponements - a protest, etc.) before being eliminated by Island Celtic following great away wines and the Ulster Band for generous support.

The Clubs first venture into Saturday football was a big

success, with the team, under the guidance of Jim Ryan strongly challenging for honours in Div. 2. up to mid-January. However, the loss of silly points to lesser teams saw them fade from contention to finish a respectable fifth.

In the Diffney Cup, an exciting victory over I.P.P. was followed by a disappointing performance against Naas United who won on penalties. The First Team, after a disastrous first half of the Season regained some of their pride under the guidance of Manager Joe (Dodo) Murray. From an embarrassing foot of the table position they climbed to a respectable ninth - a little more luck and a lot more effort from the players concerned could have improved this even further.

The Cup competitions followed a similar pattern. In the Leinster Junior Cup they made an early exit to Greenhills Celtic. A good run in the F.A.I. with victories over Colepark, Newtown Rangers and Brendanville was brought to naught by Dingle Utd. In the Sheeran Cup an easy win over Postal Albion was followed by a controversial defeat by Edenderry Town in a match switched from home tie to an away.
