Mr. O' Brien of Maynooth Park did a great job with the first cutting of the Greens in Straffan Way and Maynooth Park. The sit-on mower that he was using would cost in the region of £1000 to buy for ourselves. When cutting the Greens for the second time, the handful of volunteer residents, doing so have had to be satisfied with two or three small motor mowers, and this involves a lot of work. (By the way, if you happen to see reside nts cutting or raking grass, please don't think that that is their business; all hands are very welcome. We know we did not notify you of the first cutting: we will try to do so in future, so that the Committee can rely on volunteers to at least help with the patch in front of their houses.)

Grass-cutting is annoying but we will have to try and organize some way of tackling it on a year-to-year basis.
