



## Editorial

As the Italian poet, Cesare Pavese wrote, "We do not remember days we remember moments"; we will all have moments that will frame our memories of 2016. For me, one of the most concerning moments was when I attended the meeting about the campaign for more community policing in the town.

I was surprised to hear our very experienced public representatives tell the meeting that the decision on the allocation of Gardai is made by the Garda Commissioner, Ms. Noreen O'Sullivan and that she did not have the control over where Gardai were allocated because the policing policy is that local Garda management would not suffer reduced numbers in their divisions so that the clear under provision of Gardai in Kildare could be addressed.

I was always of the impression that the boss made the decisions but clearly not in An Garda Siochana. The only positive thing that I heard at that meeting was that the new Policing Authority might be able to force the Garda Commissioner to provide more Gardai in Kildare. Kildare has the lowest ratio of Gardai per population numbers so well done to the group who are keeping a focus on this issue. It looks as if this one has more time to run.

Meanwhile, there are other factors that should be considered when we are thinking about public safety. For me, I have a concern about the poor quality of public lighting in Maynooth, most especially in the residential estates. There are far too few public lights in many estates and in many cases their value is diminished by the proximity of large trees blocking the lighting.

My own opinion on this is that there is a need for a comprehensive review of public lighting in estates and an urgent need to supplement it where necessary. Again we are now paying large Property Tax bills and it is time that this money was spent on something that is badly needed. Good lighting deters crime and anti-social behaviour. Maynooth is a unique town where a high proportion of the population are transient so it is not easy to know the majority of people that you come into contact with. As Michael Conrad the American character actor who appeared frequently on television and was best known for his recurring role as the desk sergeant Phil Esterhaus on "Hill Street Blues" would say – Let's be careful out there.

While those of us able to celebrate the festive season are entitled to a time of year that is special for most of us, it is appropriate to think of those around us and elsewhere for which 2016 is a year that they would prefer to forget. I am thinking in particular for people who suffered tragedies especially when they arrive unexpectedly, as well as those who have lost a family member or are living with concerns for their own health or that of another member of their family. Also this is a time of the year to reach out to others such as your neighbours especially if they have lived close to you and you have not yet had any contact. Best Wishes to you all for the festive season and the year ahead.

#### MAYNOOTH NEWSLETTER INTERVIEW WITH JOHN KAVANAGH CHAIRMAN OF MAYNOOTH TIDY TOWNS

What Tidy Towns Volunteers do? They generally do tidy ups- flower and bulb planting – litter picks, painting of bollards-fences-derelict buildings etc. Graffiti removal- grass cuttinganything that improves the look of our town – river cleans ups. Bird and Bat boxes etc.

#### When do they meet?

This is all done on a voluntary basis Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays meeting in the Courthouse Square, you will be notified by text or just turn up, you can come whenever suits- no roll call, some more younger Volunteers needed- grey hair not a necessity – but sense of humour is needed. Fully insured whilst on duty. For further information ring...087 3153189.

How do you raise your funding? Our annual collection takes place each May at Supermarkets and Church gates Proceeds go to pay for hanging baskets, flower beds, insurance, equipment, petrol/machinery. Also we receive donations from various businesses which are used to purchase tools, gloves, Mutt Mitts (Dog bags), black bags, paint and timber and pay for the recycling of Green waste. Kildare County Council over the years have given us Grants towards projects e.g. Japanese Knotweed, Name stones, and Biodiversity. We have entered a number of competitions and won prize money which was spent on Big Belly Compactors and planters. As you walk around Maynooth you can see a number of flower beds that have been sponsored by various businesses and organisations are planted with Bee and Butterfly friendly plants. This project we hope will be taken up and extended in residential areas.

New category for 2017 National Tidy Towns Competition? National Tidy Towns Competition 2017. We are in a new category this is because of increased population as per latest census (over 15,000).

It is our target to try and maintain our Gold Medal and this will need a concerted effort by Local Businesses, Kildare County Council, Litter wardens and of course the general public.

#### Is there much damage done?

It is soul destroying for our volunteers to see damage to our projects e.g. 3 barrel planters were stolen during the month of November. On occasions plants have been removed from planters or flower beds. Other damage done e.g. Graffiti around the town and wheelie bins and also flower planters, removed and thrown into the river. Signage taken from a number of our projects. We thank all from Maynooth University who help to clean up after their Colleagues social events (Christmas day party etc.), and hope more will follow their example.

#### Campaign for 7 day clean ups?

Thanks to all who contacted Kildare County Council or their Local Councillor in our campaign to get 7 day cleaning for Maynooth. We plan to meet with the some members of Maynooth Business Association, Local Councillors and other interested parties in December and to develop a Litter and environment strategy for Maynooth.

#### **Christmas Bonus**

#### Question

## I'm getting a social welfare payment. Will I get a Christmas Bonus?

#### Answer

The Christmas Bonus is paid to people getting a long-term social welfare payment. Long-term social welfare payments include the following:

- State Pensions and Widow's/Widower's/Surviving Civil Partner's Pensions
- Invalidity Pension, Blind Pension, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit, Domiciliary Care Allowance and guardian's payments
- Jobseeker's Transitional payment, One Parent Family Payment, Farm Assist, Deserted Wife's Benefit and Allowance
- Community Employment, Rural Social Scheme, Tús, Gateway, Back to Work Enterprise Allowance and Job Initiative
- Back to Education Allowance (BTEA), VTOS and Further Education and Training (FET) training allowance (people coming from jobseeker's payments must have been on their payment and/or BTEA or VTOS or FET training allowance for 15 months)

For Jobseeker's Allowance or Basic Supplementary Welfare Allowance, you must be getting the payment for 15 months to get a Christmas Bonus.

In 2016 the Christmas Bonus will be 85% of your normal weekly payment (including the Living Alone Increase, the Island Allowance and the Over-80 Increase). Fuel Allowance is not included when calculating the Christmas Bonus. The minimum Christmas Bonus payment is €20.

For Domiciliary Care Allowance (DCA), which is paid monthly, the bonus is 85% of the **weekly** payment. The DCA portion of the bonus is calculated independently of other payments. So, for example, if you are getting DCA for one child, 85% of the weekly payment is 60.70.

#### Holidays at Christmas Question

#### I work full-time, Monday to Friday. What days off will I get at Christmas? Answer

Christmas Day (25 December), St Stephen's Day (26 December) and New Year's Day (1 January) are public holidays every year.

In 2016 Christmas Day falls on a Sunday and St Stephen's Day falls on a Monday. New Year's Day 2017 falls on a Sunday.

Where a public holiday falls on a weekend, you do not have any automatic legal entitlement to have the **next** working day off work. This means that, for example, Tuesday 27 December 2016 is not a public holiday. Your employer can require you to attend work on that day. Your public holiday entitlement for Christmas Day will be one of the following:

- A paid day off within a month of the public holiday
- An additional day of annual leave
- An additional day's pay

Under the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997, you may ask your employer, at least 21 days before a public holiday, which of the alternatives will apply to you. Your employer should respond to you at least 14 days before the public holiday. In practice, many employers will give employees Tuesday 27 December and Monday 2 January off in lieu of Christmas Day and New Year's Day – but it is important to remember that this is not an automatic entitlement.

You can find out more about public holidays in the **Explanatory Booklet on Holidays and Public Holidays** (**pdf**) which is available from the Workplace Relations Commission website, workplacerelations.ie.

If you do not get your public holiday entitlement, you may make a complaint under the Organisation of Working Time Act within 6 months of the dispute or complaint occurring. You must use the online complaint form available on **workplacerelations.ie.** 

## Tenants with landlords living abroad Question

Our landlady lives in Spain and we pay rent into her bank account. Is it true that we need to collect the tax she is liable for? Answer

Yes, if you pay rent directly to a landlord (or landlady) who lives abroad, you must deduct tax from the rent and account for it to Revenue, whether by paying it to Revenue or by reducing your tax credits. You deduct the tax at the standard

reducing your tax credits. You deduct the tax at the standard rate (20% at present) from the gross amount of rent that you pay. This deduction is not your tax relief – it is tax payable to Revenue from your landlady's income.

Say, for example, you pay gross monthly rent of 1,500 directly to your landlady. The amount of tax to deduct is 20% of 1,500, which is 300. Subtract this from the gross rent to get net monthly rent of 1,200. You pay this to your landlady. The amount due to Revenue is the 300 per month that you deducted.

(The situation is different for a tenant who pays rent through an agent to a landlord living abroad. In this situation, you do not deduct tax from the rent. The landlord's collection agent must account for it in an annual tax return.)

You must account to Revenue for the tax that you deduct from the gross rent. If you fail to deduct the tax and account for it, this will mean that you (not your landlady) will be liable for any tax that should have been deducted.

If you pay tax under PAYE, you can account for it by reducing your tax credits and Standard Rate Cut-Off Point. You can notify your local Revenue Office and ask them to arrange this. Alternatively, you can make a tax return on **Form 12 (pdf)** and pay the retained amount to Revenue.

If you pay tax under self-assessment, you should include the details of your rent with your annual return on <u>Form 11</u> (<u>pdf).</u> A notice of assessment will then issue to you, showing your reduced tax credits. At the end of the year you must give your landlady a completed <u>Certificate of Income Tax Deducted - Form</u> <u>R185 (pdf).</u>

#### Buying goods online Question

#### I have ordered a few presents from a Belgian website. Can I return them if I'm not happy with them when they arrive? Answer

Online purchases within the EU are covered by the EU Directive on Consumer Rights. Under this Directive you are entitled to a cooling-off period of 14 days. During the cooling-off period, you can cancel distance contracts such as online purchases without giving a reason and without incurring charges or penalties, other than possible charges incurred in returning the goods. The 14-day cooling-off period begins on the day that you receive the goods.

Upon cancellation, the distance seller is obliged to repay you within 14 days, including delivery costs. If you chose a more expensive type of delivery than the seller's cheapest standard delivery, you are only entitled to be refunded the cost of the cheaper delivery type. The seller can withhold the repayment until the goods are returned or until you supply evidence that you have sent the goods back.

You must send the goods back within 14 days of informing the seller of the cancellation. You have to pay for the cost of returning them, unless the seller did not inform you before you ordered the goods that you would have to bear the cost.

The seller should have provided you with confirmation of the contract, as well as information on aftersales and guarantees, how to cancel the contract and a postal address for complaints. If the seller did not provide you with information on your right to cancel, the cooling-off period can be extended by 12 months.

Cancellation may not be accepted in certain cases, for example, if the goods were made especially for you.

#### Flu vaccination Question I have been told I need to get a flu vaccine. Can I get it for free?

#### Answer

Influenza, usually known as the flu, is highly infectious and anyone can get it. However some groups are at greater risk of complications if they get the flu. This includes people over the age of 65, pregnant women and people who have a chronic medical condition.

The flu vaccine can help protect you from getting the flu. The flu virus changes every year and this is why there is a new vaccine each year. Vaccination is strongly recommended if you:

- Are aged 65 and over
- Have a long-term medical condition such as diabetes, heart, kidney, liver, lung or neurological disease
- Have an impaired immune system due to disease or treatment
- Have a body mass index (BMI) over 40
- Are pregnant
- Live in a nursing home or other long-stay institution
- Are a carer or a healthcare worker
- Have regular contact with poultry, water fowl or pigs

You can get the vaccine from your GP (family doctor) or pharmacist. Children can get the vaccine from a GP. The vaccine itself is free of charge if you are in one of the recommended groups. However, doctors and pharmacists may charge a consultation fee when they give you the vaccine.

If you have a medical card or GP visit card you can get the vaccine without being charged a consultation fee.

#### Local Property Tax (LPT) Discretionary €645,389 Allocation to be Agreed for Maynooth Municipal District (MD)

Cllr. John McGinley has proposed that the following works be funded from the LPT Discretionary Fund of €645,389:

- Proper drainage and surfacing of the road behind house numbers 826 to 837 Old Greenfield, Maynooth. As I pointed out in my Motion to the MD meeting on 20 October this Back Lane is used by all of the residents for access to their houses. Most of these residents are Senior Citizens and the Back Lane is hazardous for them in its present state.
- Resurface the footpath from house 351 to 342 (down as far as the bollards), Old Greenfield, as it is in a very poor condition.
- The footpaths in other areas of Old Greenfield need re-surfacing
- Resurface the footpath from Beaufield to the Health Board houses on Newtown Road as it is a very poor condition. As you know this footpath is highly pedestrianised.
- Put double yellow lines in Silken Vale as per the email from the Residents' Association dated 8 November. Also, a single white line down the middle of the road to the blind corner on the way into the estate.
- Move the pedestrian lights from the existing position in Straffan Village to the Straffan Inn location as per my motion to the MD meeting on 9 November.
- Provide a bus shelter on the New Road (School Road), Straffan
- Include Maynooth as one of the two towns in MD for the Health Check Initiative/Public Realm Plan.
- Extension of the wall at the right hand side entrance to Greenfield Estate (Greenfield Shopping Centre) in order to help prevent anti-social behaviour at this location.

#### Update on Cllr. John McGinley's Motion Seeking Funding for Maynooth Ring Road

The Chief Executive of Kildare County Council, Peter Carey, has applied to the Government for €67m from the Local Infrastructure Housing Activation Fund. This includes €20m for the Maynooth Eastern Ring Road from Dublin Road to the Straffan Road.

### Cllr. McGinley Gets Safety Improvements at the Boys School, Maynooth

As a result of Cllr. John McGinley's motion to the Maynooth MD bollards have been erected on the footpath from the Boys School to the entrance to the Post Primary School. This will prevent motorists from parking on the footpath and improve safety for pedestrians.

#### Cllr. McGinley Seeks Access to the New Road for the Existing Houses Rear Garden Houses in Old Greenfield

Cllr. McGinley got the following reply to his motion:

The Planning permission is a live permission relating to a housing development at Old Greenfield, Maynooth, and is essentially an extension of duration to a previous permission, extending the planning period to 29 October 2018.

The applicant / developer has until this time to take up his permission. The development is to be carried out and completed in accordance with the terms of the öriginal'permission. Compliance with the terms of the planning permission will be monitored and any noncompliance may result in enforcement proceedings as and when appropriate.

Cllr. McGinley has asked the Director of Planning to take an active interest to ensure that the houses have

access to the new road as Planners gave permission for the road and the houses. It is therefore Kildare County Council Planners responsibility to overcome this serious problem.

### Cllr. McGinley Calls for Seven Day Street Cleaning for Maynooth.

Cllr. John McGinley submitted the following motion for the consideration of the Maynooth MD meeting on 20 October:

"That a seven day street cleaning service be provided by the council in Maynooth."

#### John got the following reply:

"A submission has forwarded to Finance Section to include an increase in funding to provide for an extra street sweeping services in Maynooth. This can be considered in the context of Budget 2017."

John made the point that Maynooth is unique being the only University town in Ireland and when students are included Maynooth has a population of 24,000. So, a five day street cleaning is not good enough for such a population. John also pointed out that Maynooth had a six day cleaning service up to 2012.

The Director of Services has advised Cllr. McGinley that there is an additional €54,000 allocated countywide in the Budget for street sweeping and that there are ongoing discussions between the Roads Section and the Environment Section on how much of this will be allocated for Maynooth.

#### Cllr McGinley Seeks Directional Signage for Public Car Park in Maynooth

Cllr. McGinley has made the following submission to the Council:

"Directional signage is badly needed for the public car park in Maynooth. It is especially needed for strangers to the town as they don't know that it exists and that is half empty most of the time.

This issue was discussed by the Director of Services in relation to Naas at the SPC meeting on 3 November."

### Stagg Welcomes Re-Invitation of Tenders for Maynooth Education Campus

Kildare North Labour Representative Emmet Stagg has welcomed confirmation from the Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board that Tenders were invited from pre-qualified contractors for the Maynooth Education Campus Project on Friday October 28th. Mr. Stagg said the Maynooth Education Campus Project involves the construction of two new Post Primary Schools and a Shared Sports Facility at an estimated value of €30 Million and the envisaged construction period is 24 months.

10 contractors who came through the pre-qualification process for contractors have been requested to submit tenders for the project.

In conclusion Mr. Stagg stated that we are nearly at the conclusion of the re-tendering process for the Maynooth Education Campus and expressed confidence that Construction would begin on site in the first quarter of 2017.

#### Hands Off Free Travel - Stagg

Reacting to the Review complied by the National Transport Authority and Iarnrod Eireann to examine possible solutions for the Financial Stability of Iarnrod Eireann, Labour Spokesperson on Older People Emmet Stagg has condemned the suggestion in the Review that the Free Travel Scheme should be reformed to save money.

Mr. Stagg stated that there is no doubt there is a serious funding crisis within Iarnrod Eireann, but Government Ministers Leo Vardakar T.D. and Shane Ross T.D.

should immediately move to dismiss any suggestion that the Free Travel Scheme will be reformed. They need to be clear that there will be no changes to the existing scheme and if that means stumping up an additional €6 Million per year to cover the actual cost of the scheme to Iarnrod Eireann, then so be it.

It is estimated that 4.6 Million passenger journeys in 2016 will avail of Free Travel on Rail Services and this in itself shows how popular the scheme is with Older People. It gives them the opportunity to see parts of the Country that they may not have seen before and gives them an opportunity to travel with friends for outings, an important social service in preventing isolation. Using commuter services also allows older people to get on with their daily routine. We want to encourage the use of Public Transport not put obstacles in the way of Older People stated Mr. Stagg.

In conclusion Emmet Stagg again called on Ministers Varadkar and Ross to explicitly state that there will be no changes to the Free Travel Scheme to remove the fears of Older People.

## Stagg Calls on McEntee to Publish Proposals on National Positive Ageing Strategy.

Labour Spokesperson on Older People Emmet Stagg has called on the Minister of State at the Department of Health, Helen McEntee T.D., to publish their new implementation proposal for the National Positive Ageing Strategy.

Mr. Stagg stated 'We have a Blueprint for age related policy and service delivery in Ireland, the National Positive Ageing Strategy which was published in 2013. The Strategy offers a positive view of ageing and does not limit its remit to health issues, but rather looks at how to improve quality of life, promote independent living and deliver greater opportunities for older people. Disappointingly the specific Implementation of the National Positive Ageing Strategy was not included in the 'Programme for Partnership Government', stated Mr. Stagg.

'My colleague Joan Burton T.D., at my request, questioned Minister McEntee on the Strategy recently in the Dail and Minister McEntee responded as follows: *As the Deputy may be aware my Department is developing a new implementation proposal for the National Positive Ageing Strategy. This plan proposes mechanisms to facilitate the identification by NGO stakeholders of their policy priorities, along with regular on-going structured engagement between relevant State Agencies and stakeholders on the key issues so identified. The details of the above will be finalised shortly.*'

Concluding Labour Spokesperson on Older People Emmet Stagg stated that Groups advocating on behalf of Older people want to see how this implementation process will work and it was important that the proposals were published as soon as possible.

## Cllr. McGinley Asks for The Square, Maynooth to be Repaired

Cllr. John McGinley submitted the following motion for the consideration of the Maynooth MD meeting on 9 November:

"When will the council replace the tarmacadam and the broken flags on the Square in Maynooth with proper flagstones?"

John was given the following reply:

"The municipal district office is in discussions with Gas Networks Ireland about the restoration of this section of the Square."

#### (Continued from page 8) Allocation of New Gardaí perpetuates Garda Manning Shortfall in Kildare - Stagg

Kildare North Labour Representative Emmet Stagg has condemned the number of newly attested Gardaí assigned to the Kildare Division since the re-opening of the Garda Training College in Templemore in September 2014.

Mr. Stagg stated that since the re-opening of the College 534 recruits have been assigned to various Garda Divisions throughout the State. Of these 25 recruits, or 4.7% have been assigned to the Kildare Division. The population of Kildare makes up 4.7% of the State's population. So allocations to date of new recruits are having no impact on the fact that we have the worst ratio of Gardaí to population in the State, of 1:751.

If we are to reduce this unacceptable under manning of Garda Manpower in the Kildare Division, we have to be assigned greater numbers over and above our current percentage of the State's population. What we have here is an effective standstill situation. We may be getting a correct percentage of allocations by population now, but this ignores the historical position of under manning.

The Commissioner accepted that there was an imbalance of Garda to population when I raised this issue with her in April 2015. The Commissioner pointed out that the moratorium on recruitment was a major obstacle to deploying additional resources to the Kildare Division. We now have recruitment, yet the imbalance is not been redressed.

In conclusion Kildare North Labour Representative Emmet Stagg stated that he will raise this serious issue again with the Garda Commissioner as we now have the opportunity to correct this wrong as the Garda Force is expected to grow to 15,000 members. If the correction is not implemented now it never will be.

## Extra Bus Service for Maynooth and Celbridge says O'Rourke

Local Fianna Fail TD, Frank O Rourke, has been informed by Dublin Bus that it will now operate a new Sunday service on their Route 67 commencing on Sunday 27th of November.

'I will continue to make further representations of behalf of our public transport users and I welcome this new service for Maynooth and Celbridge on Route 67.' Concluded Deputy O'Rourke

### Increased investment for mental health services needed says O'Rourke

Local Fianna Fáil TD, Frank O Rourke, says his party is pushing hard for a significant increase in funding for mental health services. Deputy O'Rourke made his comments after contributing in the Dáil debate on the future of mental health services, based on a private members motion submitted by his party.

"Our arrangement with Fine Gael commits to the full implementation of the 'A Vision for Change' policy. This is regarded as a best practice approach in mental health policy terms. It remains a key priority for us to have the vision for change policies adopted. There has been significant under investment in mental health services in recent years and this practice must change." said Deputy O'Rourke.

"The July 2016 estimate from the Department of Health outlines that the required resources to fully implement 'A Vision for Change' is €177.3m, or €35.4m over five years. The funding committed by the Government for 2017 is just €15m, so a significant increase in mental health spending is needed."

"Fianna Fáil has made clear that mental health spending can't be put on the backburner, so it's time for the Government to outline their plan for mental health services.

"Apart from improving the person, improving the mental health of the population of Ireland is an essential foundation for economic and social recovery. As I said in the Dail earlier this year, over 450,000 people in Ireland experience depression at any one time and people with a mental health disability are 9 times more likely to be outside the labour force. 1 in 7 adults in Ireland will have experienced a mental health difficulty in the last year and 9% of the population aged 15 or over has a mental health problem according to the Healthy Ireland survey."

"Currently the Government allocates funding to mental health on a year to year basis, we need to see a multi annual budget for mental health. Such a funding model would assist in putting mental health on a more solid funding foundation. Not having such a plan is preventing long term planning and development from taking place. Having a multi-annual budget and plan so that our mental health services can be developed with certainty must be a priority for Government." concluded Deputy O'Rourke.

## Making progress on Broadband Coverage – further progress needed says O'Rourke

Local Fianna Fail TD, Frank O Rourke, has said today that he is continuing to keep the pressure on Eir in connection with the timelines for the rollout of their fibre broadband technology, in particular the fibre to the home (FTTH) technology, to many parts of North Kildare. He was speaking following a meeting with Eir's senior executives in Leinster House recently.

'Eir's relatively new FTTH (Fibre To the Home) technology is designed for rural areas where bringing copper wires from cabinets proves more difficult." Stated Deputy O'Rourke.

"I continue to make representations to Eir in relation to securing adequate Broadband coverage for areas such as; Newtown, Broadford, Timahoe, Eadestown and Kilteel. By the end of March next, over 2,500 additional rural Kildare premises will be connected to broadband by the Fibre to the home technology (FTHH). 400 rural premises in the Maynooth area, 370 in Kilcock, 480 in Donadea, 520 in Straffan and 470 in Carbury are examples of the planned rollout for this year in rural Kildare."

"Kilcock for example currently has 2,400 homes and businesses that have access to broadband speeds of up to 100Mb/s, with further connections planned. In Maynooth, 4,500 homes and businesses have access to speeds of up to 100Mb/s and a further 400 homes and businesses have been earmarked for fibre to the home by June 2017. Today in Celbridge, over 7,400 homes and businesses have access to speeds of up to 100Mb/s. An additional 150 premises are due to be covered by Eir's fibre to the home rollout by June 2017.' Stated Deputy O'Rourke.

#### Tenders to be sought for New Bus Route linking Naas, Clane, Rathcoffey, Maynooth and Blanchardstown says Deputy O'Rourke

Local Fianna Fail TD, Frank O Rourke, has been informed by the National Transport Authority (NTA) that it is hoped to seek tenders for the proposed new Bus Service linking Naas, Clane, Rathcoffey, Maynooth, Blancharstown and Blancharstown Hospital.

'In April of this year, the NTA confirmed to me, following my presentations, that they would consider this bus service. I am delighted now, following further representations, that the NTA will seek tenders for this new service early in 2017.'

'Linking Naas, Clane, Rathcoffey, Maynooth and Blancharstown has been one of the missing public transport services. Naas, Maynooth and Blancharstown are all key employment towns, all three towns are key retail centres, Maynooth has a University and all three towns have hospitals. It will also open up these towns for the rent to room schemes for students studying in NUI Maynooth. '

'Linking these towns, and their services, will provide an important service for the people in the North Kildare area, improve the commercial activity in the towns and ensure that more services and educational opportunities are available for all.'

'Since getting elected, I have being campaigning for improved public transport services for commuters in North Kildare. We have made progress on the Bus Service for Kilcock commuters, plans are in place for a Park and Ride at Kilcock and additional services planned for Leixlip bus commuters, address the fare structure anomaly for Kilcock rail commuters and provide better public transport services for Clane and Prosperous commuters, in particular linking these towns to St Stephens Green and UCD.'

'As I outlined to the NTA, once we achieve a regular, reliable and inclusive public transport service, we will attract more people to use it and thereby make it more efficient. I intend to keep making representations until we make further progress on public transport services.' concluded Deputy O'Rourke.

## O Rourke presses for Additional Park and Ride places for Maynooth

Local Fianna Fáil TD, Frank O Rourke, has called on the Government to increase the resources to Irish Rail to provide additional park and ride places for Maynooth Bus and Rail commuters.

'One of my first meetings when I got elected in February was in relation to public transport services. I was delighted that in April, the NTA put the provision of a bus service from Naas to Blanchardstown via Clane, Rathcoffey and Maynooth on its agenda which following my representations.'

'Progress has also been made in improving the Bus Service for Kilcock commuters and now we have made significant progress on providing a Park and Ride at Kilcock on the Old Galway Road. However, Maynooth needs more park and ride places and I believe that resources should be provided to increase the number of car parking places in Maynooth for public transport users.' Stated Deputy O'Rourke.

'Maynooth is served well by both Rail and Bus from a timetable perspective, but given the low cost of money, the Government should provide capital for extra park and ride places. I will be raising this matter in the Dáil.'

#### Street Sweeping For Towns In North Kildare

Local Fianna Fail TD, Frank O'Rourke, has been informed by Kildare Co. Co. that street sweeping for towns in North Kildare is to be extended into weekends and will include Maynooth, Celbridge, Leixlip and Naas.

'In recent months, weekend street sweeping has been requested by tidy town committees, local businesses and community groups for towns of Maynooth, Celbridge, Leixlip and Naas.'

'Together with these groups, I made representations to Kildare Co. Co. and asked them to consider extending the street sweeping into the weekends.'

'Groups like the tidy towns and local businesses put in considerable efforts into keeping these towns clean and deserve great credit for their work. Putting in place a weekend street sweeping programme for these towns will provide assistance to these groups and give recognition to the valuable contribution they make to our community.'

'As I understand it, the environment and transport departments of Kildare Co Co are working together to agree how this programme can be best implemented, which I hope will commence in early 2017.' Concluded Deputy O'Rourke.





#### 🗼 IRISH CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS 🙀

Ireland, like most countries, has a number of Christmas traditions that are all of its own. Many of these customs have their root in the time when the Gaelic culture and religion of the country were being supressed and it is perhaps because of that they have survived into modern times.

#### THE CANDLE IN THE WINDOW



The placing of a lighted candle in the window of a house on Christmas eve is still practised today. It has a number of purposes but primarily it was a symbol of welcome to Mary and Joseph as they travelled looking for shelter.

The candle also indicated a safe place for priests to perform mass as, during Penal Times this was not allowed.

A further element of the tradition is that the candle should be lit by the youngest member of the household and only be extinguished by a girl bearing the name 'Mary'.

#### THE LADEN TABLE



After evening meal on Christmas eve the kitchen table was again set and on it was placed a loaf of bread filled with caraway seeds and raisins, a pitcher of milk and a large lit candle. The door to the house was left unlatched so that

Mary and Joseph, or any wandering traveller, could avail of the welcome.

#### THE WREN BOY PROCESSION



During Penal Times there was once a plot in a village against the local soldiers. They were surrounded and were about to be ambushed when a group of wrens pecked on their drums and awakened the soldiers. The plot failed and the wren became known as 'The Devil's bird'. On St. Stephens

day a procession takes place where a pole with a holly bush is carried from house to house and families dress up in old clothes and with blackened faces. In olden times an actual wren would be killed and placed on top of the pole.

This custom has to a large degree disappeared but the tradition of visiting from house to house on St. Stephens Day has survived and is very much part of Christmas.

#### DECORATIONS



The placing of a ring of Holly on doors originated in Ireland as Holly was one of the main plants that flourished at Christmas time and which gave the poor ample means with which to decorate their dwellings.

All decorations are traditionally taken down on Little Christmas (January 6th.) and it is considered to be bad luck to take them down beforehand.





### Notes of MCC meeting held on Monday Nov 14th at Maynooth Community Space.

Chairman Tom McMullon expressed the sympathies of those present to council member Paddy Holmes and the Holmes family on the death of their mother Mary. At the time of her passing, Mrs Holmes was Maynooth's oldest citizen.

TIDY TOWNS ADDRESS ON THE GOLD MEDAL Richard Farrell and Mattie Callaghan addressed the meeting on the recent Tidy Towns Gold Medal win. They also won a Pollinator award this year and Tina Drury won a Local Hero award. The medal will be brought to schools and any other organisation that wishes to have the Tidy Towns speak to their group on the win and current works being carried out. Richard noted the work carried out over the past 30 years and mentioned that Maynooth Tidy Towns Committee grew out of MCC. He mentioned some people that were pivotal in the inception of the group and thanked Bob Reilly, Sean Lyons, Mattie Callaghan and Fionan Hardiman among others. Tom McMullon praised the work of MTT and noted that they are now entering a new level of competition. He said that although the group is strong, extra help is always needed and welcomed. He expressed a wish to see a Kildare National winner in the near future. Mattie thanked all the volunteers and is looking forward to future work as there is still lots to be done. He informed the meeting that litter picking had ceased for the months of Oct and Nov to highlight to KCC that the town needs a 7-day cleaning service. Planters and flower beds have benefited since the litter picking stopped as litter was usually prioritised.

Conor Dempsey requested more community involvement in order for the group to further thrive and suggested that this should begin with our young people. He suggested bringing children out on MTT mornings and showing them how to plant bulbs and tend to flower beds and encouraging children against littering. They are after all the future of the town. The Chairman also noted that the schools have green flags but the ideals don't seem to extend from the school into the community. The address was ended with a round of applause for the Tidy Towns achievement.

#### STREET BEGGING

The subject of begging was raised again and questions were asked about what could be done. Is there a case for involving Social Welfare? Can KCC investigate? The Chairman suggested that it might be worthwhile to contact

MCC – WELCOME PACK AND BRIEF OUTLINE OF THE WORKINGS OF MCC

Paul Croghan noted that there is a failure to inform new members of the Council about the workings and the mandate of the Council. A welcome pack needs to be compiled and distributed among members. This will be part of the upcoming review and facilitation. Paul gave a brief outline of the function of the Council. It is a Community Development organisation which has been in operation for almost 40 years. It has delivered initiatives such as the Citizens Advice Bureau, the summer festival, expanded the St Patrick's Day Parade, Twinning, Tidy Towns, and the provision of the Community Space which is used by many diverse groups and organisations. There was also the Canal Scheme which has since successfully amalgamated with the Community Employment scheme. The Council is there to recognise things missing in our town and to hopefully fill the gaps.

SEVEN-DAY STREET CLEANING SERVICE Cllr Naoise Ó Cearúil informed the group that both he and John McGinley had submitted motions that a provision be made in budgetary planning for a 7-day service. The previous street cleaner had been reassigned and his replacement had resigned his post within 3 weeks which was adding to the delay in providing the service. Paul Croghan said that a town which has activities 7 days a week needs a 7-day a week cleaning service. KCC raises a lot of money through rates and suggested that a sizable portion of rates and Local Property Tax should be put back into the community. He also suggested that the outlying areas be considered as well as the town centre. Cllr Teresa Murray agreed with the 7-day cleaning proposal but also noted that businesses must shoulder some responsibility and keep the area around their own premises clean. Miriam O'Keeffe Ahern asked if any exit interviews were held to gain knowledge as to the high turnover of staff. Naoise Ó Cearúil clarified that there is not a high turnover of staff, and that the previous street cleaner had been in place for many years but his replacement had found the job tough on a personal level.

Anne Birchall asked if there was any financial input from Maynooth University towards the work of Tidy Towns and street cleaning in general. Richard Farrell said the Students Union had sponsored many different programmes including the flowers on the roundabout on the

Kilcock Road and the Mutt Mitts which are bag dispensers to aid dog owners to clean up after their pets. Niamh Halpenny (MSU rep) added that the SU sends out clean up teams after big student nights and that the University itself needs to have a greater input into the needs of the town. Richard agreed and added that the numbers of volunteers are not adequate for the population of the area. Padraig Ó Murchú said that a clean town should be a matter of civic pride for all residents and asked if a Litter Warden could be put in place with the power to fine offenders on the spot. It was agreed that a letter be sent to KCC Director of Services Joe Boland outlining concerns and requesting a solution. The attendees agreed.

#### QUESTIONS RAISED AT THE MEETING

Questions were raised and concerns expressed about the identity of MCC and MCC Ltd, about the accounting structure within MCC Ltd, its relationship with the Department of Social Protection and implications for fundraising. Anne Birchall expressed her support of the scheme but strongly felt these issues need to be addressed.

Apparent changes in recent weeks to the constitution was brought to the attention of the meeting. A sub-committee was established to investigate how this had come about.

Peter Garrad of Maynooth Scouts thanked Cllr Naoise Ó Cearúil for organising the tarmac for the Scout Den.

Cllr Teresa Murray was thanked for organising the public meeting with reference to policing in our town. Cllr Murray added that there would be a meeting of the Joint Policing Committee on December 5th at 7pm with registration from 6.30. The public can have their say at this meeting. Residents that cannot attend can make representation by email to cpnkag@gmail.com or fill out the survey at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/7D7CD28. There are also petitions in local shops.

#### **Ring Road for Maynooth**

I am in ongoing discussion with the Kildare and Meath County Councils, National University of Ireland Maynooth and the National Transport Authority with regard to the Maynooth ring road. All of these organisations have been made aware just how important this is to the town. Residents and business have regularly raised this matter with me. I will continue to work with all stakeholders to progress this project.

#### **Street Cleaning in Maynooth**

I have again raised the issue of additional street cleaning for Maynooth town following meetings with Kildare County Council County Manager Peter Carey and Director of Services Niall Morrissey on the matter. The issue of litter in the streets, particularly over the weekends in Maynooth has become topical recently. With the college at full capacity street cleaning services needed to be increased. I have had many locals come into my Maynooth office off the Main Street raising this very valid concern.

At my meeting with senior council officials I explained the urgent need for this service to be provided. Following this the Director of Services confirmed to me that it was being seriously considered for 2017 subject to budget approval.

We have seen Maynooth have continued success in the Tidy Towns Competition and this cleaning service will only aid and compliment the excellent work they carry out. I am delighted there is an agreement and understanding from the council and that in January the service should commence subject to budget approval by the Maynooth Municipal District meeting.

#### **Government Must Act on Lowering Car Insurance** Costs

Kildare North TD James Lawless has condemned the Government's lack of action on tackling the anomaly whereby returning Irish emigrants are being forced out of the car insurance market due to extremely high quotations. In many cases they cannot find a company or broker who will insure them and often the figure can run into tens of thousands when they do find someone willing to take them on.

This is not the first time I have assisted a resident who has returned to Kildare, eager to start working at home again, only to be set back by soaring motor insurance

cost, all because he or she had been living out of the country and driving experience and no claims bonuses were not recognised during their time away. It is imperative that the actions set out in a recently agreed Dáil motion on motor insurance, initiated by Fianna Fáil, are implemented without further delay. The passing of our motion recently was the first step in a process, which will hopefully clamp down on soaring motor insurance premiums. The motion called for the introduction of practical measures such as; the reestablishment of the Motor Insurance Advisory Board on a time limited basis; greater disclosure around policy renewal notifications; action on the settlement of cases and dealing with false and exaggerated claims. We are determined to ensure that consumers get a fair deal and the series of measures my party colleagues and I have proposed, would reduce these inflated premiums for hard working residents.

#### Additional Sunday Service for 67 Route

I am delighted to say Dublin Bus have confirmed additional Sunday services to me following meetings I had held with them during the Summer on 67 route. The new timetable will mean a 67 will arrive into Celbridge & Maynooth every 30 minutes on Sunday from the 27th of this month. I am looking forward to continue working with Dublin Bus and the NTA to improve services for the commuters in Celbridge and Maynooth.

#### NUIM

As part of my role as Fianna Fáil Science, Technology, and Innovation spokesperson I was delighted to pay a visit to NUIM to give a guest lector on STEM subjects and tour the site. I was very interested in seeing the MaynoothWorks incubator hub which is a testament to advanced technological work being carried out in Maynooth on a daily basis. I want to thank everyone involved for a warm welcome and fascinating insight into the workings of the college science department.

#### **Maynooth Purple Flag Application**

Was happy to lend my support to the Maynooth Purple Flag bid launch recently. As judging gets underway there are great efforts from North Kildare Chamber, Kildare County Council, Maynooth Tidy Towns, An Gardaí and all the businesses gone into this and best of luck to them. Kildare County Council has also confirmed that street cleaning should be extended on a

weekend basis from 2017 on. This is something I raised in a meeting with senior KCC management recently and it will be another plus for the town's appearance. The purple flag is awarded based on a town's nightlife in terms of eateries, entertainment, cleanliness, security and overall ambience.

#### Minister to Review Tús and Community **Employment Schemes**

The Minister for Social Protection Leo Varadkar TD has agreed to review the operation of the Tús and Community Employment schemes following issues raised around the schemes I brought up in the Dáil. Speaking on the Order of Business I explained to the Minister that I wish to raise an issue relating to community employment placements. Traditionally, employees would have gone onto a Tús scheme. From there they would have gone on to work with a local organisation, often a community or charitable organisation, and then they would have moved onto a community employment (CE) scheme at the same location.

This worked well for the individual and the organisations. It appears that since the advent of JobPath, operated by Turas Nua and Seetec, this path is blocked and individuals coming off the Tús scheme are placed in limbo for 12 months and are unable to return to a CE scheme.

We are losing willing and able workers, most of who would be contributing to Tidy Towns groups or local charities but are now left in uncertainty. This all stems from changes made to the scheme last August when it was outsourced to private providers

Following this the Minister has agreed to review the workings of both schemes.





## MAYNOOTH CYCLING CAMPAIGN NOTES

#### **Royal Canal Greenway**

Maynooth Cycling Campaign is disappointed at the lack of conditions attached to the approval of the Part 8 Report for Royal Canal Greenway between Maynooth and Dublin. This was a lost opportunity of providing a good quality greenway as opposed to a mediocre one – one which will compare unfavourably with the Waterford Greenway now under construction. The area engineer reportedly gave an undertaking to councillors that he would fully address the concerns of Maynooth Cycling Campaign. He hasn't.



There were five pro-cycling submissions – one was an internal submission, one was from a prescribed body and three were from the general public. A number of secondary issues were raised but there were two primary issues which were common to all five submissions – surfacing and width.

In response to surfacing, the Kildare County Council's consultant is alleged to have come out against the use of a bituminous surface. It is noted that the Consultant is employed by the officials and future work is dependent on his relationship with the same officials but in an earlier report on surfacing options, the same consultant concluded:

It is recommended to provide a bituminous surface on the full length of the Galway to Dublin Greenway for reasons of quality, comfort, safety, reduced maintenance and better whole life costs.

The consultant also pointed out that a dust surface would not attract foreign visitors. Waterways Ireland claims to require a dust surface in rural areas for environmental and ecological reasons. However Waterways Ireland is happy to provide a bituminous surface for motorised traffic on some rural parts of the canal – it only develops environmental and ecological concerns where cyclists are involved.

The reasons for rejecting widening of the path are equally disingenuous. Maynooth Cycling Campaign accepts that it is not feasible to widen the greenway everywhere but it does not accept the starting point of Kildare County Council which is that it cannot be widened anywhere. Kildare County Council proposes a greenway 2.5m wide in parts - one to be shared with pedestrians. Conflicts between cyclists and pedestrians are common on such towpaths across the UK. The way to eliminate such conflicts is to follow international best practice (in so far as is feasible) such as from Germany, the Netherlands and Denmark where inter urban routes for cyclists are 4m wide.

We had also raised the following issues with councillors which we considered pertinent to any decision on the project

- Why a (50%) more expensive dust surface should be preferred rather than a cheaper and maintenance-free blacktopped surface?
- Who pays for the additional maintenance?
- Why was there no cost benefit analysis of the scheme on the Royal Canal?

None of these points were addressed in the Part 8 report.

Kildare County Council has been 'promoting' cycling for nearly twenty years and over most of that time the level of cycling has declined. A recent report into the outcome for cycling of the Smarter Travel Towns by the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport found that the level of cycling increased by 0.2% per year. With the proposed low quality greenway, the level of cycling in Kildare is unlikely to increase.

#### **EPA** Consultation on Air Pollution Monitoring

The EPA recently released a report on the Ireland's Environment: An Assessment 2016 which estimates that there are 1200 premature deaths annually resulting from air pollution and follows the UK government losing a case in the courts over its failure to tackle air pollution. While the concern is mainly in relation to Irish cities, the EPA proposes to introduce a national air pollution monitoring programme which includes Celbridge, Leixlip, Naas and Newbridge. Maynooth Cycling Campaign has proposed that monitoring should also include Maynooth because of the high levels of traffic congestion here.

#### Netflix - Bikes vs Cars

One of the films currently on offer to Netflix subscribers is Bikes vs Cars. This is a documentary film about the struggle to provide cycle facilities in the Americas and while the situation in North and South America is different from that in Europe, there are many similarities. Well worth a watch! Maynooth Cycling Campaign is a non-party political cycling advocacy group. Further information on meetings and activities is available on our website. 


# A Winter Garden

With the arrival of December, colder winter weather becomes the new norm, marking the start of a prolonged period of calm and quiet in the garden. Often ground conditions limit the opportunities to do any gardening but the occasional clear bright dry day offers some chance to doing some important garden chores where necessary.

Clear lawn areas of any fallen leaves before they block out light and moisture to the grass and use to spread around the base of trees or shrubs. Lawns can look a little off, a light clip on top and along edges will make a big difference. Now is an ideal time to plant new bare root hedging and trees (but avoid any planting when the ground is very wet). Protect the newly planted trees, hedges and shrubs from cold winds and frosts. Thick dry mulches will protect the roots from cold and branches can be covered with fleece but for older plants wait until the ground freezes before adding the mulch as this will prevent rodents from nesting in the soil. Winter storms and winds are very strong and can easily damage young trees, so check all tree ties and stakes to ensure trees are firmly secured in the ground. Prune any overhanging branches from trees or shrubs.

While bedding plants for spring colour should have been planted by now, wallflowers and pansies can still be planted, especially if they are available in pots. Perennial flowers can be divided in the ground. It is not too late to lift dahlias, begonias and gladiolus in cold localities to prevent damage, or cover them with soil in milder areas. Tulip bulbs, can be planted right up to Christmas and will flower well in the following spring. Add some fertiliser to encourage bulb root development. Watch out for pale blotches and fuzzy grey mould on leaves of winter flowering pansies, this is called downy mildew. Remove infected leaves as soon as possible and dispose of them. Give your roses a final check for mildew and if infected, spray them immediately. Tuck 1 - 2 slug pellets around your more precious plants, as slugs and snails are busy for most of the winter.







#### **Tips on the Care of The Poinsetta Plant**

Place it near a sunny window. South, east or west facing windows are preferable to a north facing window. Poinsettias are tropicals and will appreciate as much direct sunlight as you can provide. **Heat** - To keep the poinsettia in bloom as long as possible, maintain a temperature of 65 - 75 degrees F. during the day.

Dropping the temperature to about 60 degrees F. at night will not hurt the plant. However, cold drafts or allowing the leaves to touch a cold window can injure the leaves and cause premature leaf drop. If you've ever seen a gangly poinsettia in bloom, with only a couple of sad looking leaves hanging on, it was probably exposed to temperatures that were too cool or extreme shifts in temperature. **Water** - Water the plant whenever the surface feels dry to the touch. Water until it drains out the bottom, but don't let the plant sit in water.

#### **Christmas Ideas from the Garden**

Decorative Candle Display: Collect pine cones and add a couple of drops of essential oils onto them, hang them from the Christmas tree using ribbon or simply lay then around a candle.



Christmas Pot Pourri: Use dried garden herbs and cupboard ingredients. Mix juniper sprigs, dried rosebuds, bay leaves,

rosemary sprigs, cinnamon chips, cloves, and assorted pine cones together until it smells great and looks interesting. You can also add essential oils for extra scent to help retain the aroma.







### Turkey Satay Vegetables Noodles

Ingredients:

275g/10oz of fine egg noodles

- 1 tblsp of sunflower oil
- 1 large red pepper, halved, seeded and thinly sliced
- 225g/8oz of fine green beans, trimmed and halved

175g/6oz of baby corn, halved lenghtways

2 garlic cloves, crushed

400g/14oz can of coconut milk

350g/12oz leftover turkey meat, cut into bite-sized pieces

100g/4oz of crunchy peanut butter

2 tblsp of dark soy sauce

2 tblsp of sweet chilli sauce

1 tsp of muscovado sugar

Juice of ½ lime

 $50 g/2 oz \ of \ cashew \ nuts, \ to asted \ and \ finely \ chopped$ 

Handful of fresh coriander to garnish

#### Method:

Place the fine egg noodles in a pan of boiling water and cook for 3 to 4 minutes, until tender or according to the packet instructions.

Heat a wok until very hot. Add the oil and swirl it around the edges, then tip in the red pepper, green beans, baby corn and garlic and stir-fry for 3 to 4 minutes, until the vegetables are tender, sprinkling over one tablespoon of water if the mixture is getting too dry.

Drain the noodles and add to the wok with the coconut milk, turkey, peanut butter, soy sauce, chilli sauce, sugar and lime juice. Stir-fry for another 2 to 3 minutes, until all the ingredients are piping hot.

To serve, divide among warm serving bowls and scatter over the cahew nuts and coriander.

Christmas Cake Trifle

#### Ingredients:

1 small mango 1 small pineapple 1/2 pomegranate 100ml dark rum 4 tblsp flaked almonds 1/2 tblsp granulated sugar 1 splash of golden rum 250g Chrismas cake or pudding 250ml thick custard 120g cherry jam 2 clementines 230ml double cream 15g dark chocolate (70%) *Method:* 



Prepare the mango and pineapple, roughly chopping all the flesh. Place in a bowl along with the pomegranate seeds. Mix in 20ml of the dark rum and set aside.

Heat a pan over a medium heat, add the almonds and sugar and cook for 2 to 3 minutes or until golden brown. Add the golden rum and cook for a few minutes. Transfer to a bowl and leave to cool.

Roughly chop the Christmas cake or pudding, then place in a 1.5-litre glass bowl and press firmly into the base. Drizzle over the remaining 80ml dark rum then pour over the custard. Cover the bowl with cling film and refrigerate for at least 3 hours so the custard can set a little.

Remove the trifle from the fridge and spoon the cherry jam over the custard. Finely grate the elementine zest and put aside, then break up into segments. Add the chopped fruit to the trifle, then layer over the elementine segments. Whip the cream to soft peaks, then use it to top the trifle. Decorate with the toasted almonds, scatter over the reserved elementine zest, then shave over the chocolate and serve.

This is a great way to use leftover cake or pudding. The amounts here are just a guide - adjust it according to how much leftover cake you have and whatever fruits you have to hand.




